## **BARGAIN SEYCHELLES**

### for £999.99

Really — the Seychelles for less than £1,000? Actually, no. But how does this sound? If you book a week at Lazare Picault, a small, simple but characterful hotel above a fine beach on Mahé, for £1,000 with Elite (01707 371000, seychelleselite.co.uk), I'll

personally refund you the penny to bring it under our limit. The price is for trips before December 15 — which is the best time to see turtles laying, and dolphins and whale sharks off shore.

You can expect rain at this time of year, but not trip-ruining stuff — it's usually short, sharp bursts.

# **CLASSIC MALDIVES**

### for £999

It's also just about possible to do the Indian Ocean's textbook desert islands for less than £1,000. You won't have hot and cold running butlers, but you will get the obligatory swaying palms, white sands, azure water in a shallow lagoon, decent snorkelling and (unusually) good surfing outside the reef, at Chaaya Island Dhonveli. First Choice (0871 200 4455, firstchoice. co.uk) has a week for £999. flying from Manchester on November 30: what's more, the price is all-inclusive, so you're not a captive audience for overpriced food and drink.

### **CELEBRITY JAMAICA**

## for £995

Here's one we really didn't expect to be bringing you for three figures. Kate Moss, Robbie Williams, Johnny Depp, Jade Jagger: they've all been to Jake's, a chic, laid-back hideaway on Jamaica's less developed south coast. No televisions, no phones, but a deep-chilled bohemian vibe and the best rum punches on the island. The beach isn't enormous, but don't fret — you can swing in a hammock by the curvaceous saltwater pool, skank to the local reggae bands who turn up to play, and admire the mural. (Joni Mitchell painted it,

# WILD TENERIFE

## for £958

Contrary to popular belief, Tenerife is not all high-rise fringes and barren interior. Get away from the resorts and there's an otherworldly beauty here, which is best seen on foot. You'll get the full flavour on a twin-centre walking holiday with Headwater (01606 720199 headwater.com), hiking the ancient forests, vine-clad terraces and plunging valleys of Anaga National Park, and skirting crimson lava flows under snow-capped Mount Teide. You stay at a traditional finca (with a nice pool) inland, then a converted mansion on

the coast. The price is £958, including car hire, some meals, maps and notes.

## **CAMPING KENYA**

## for £916

We're used to the idea of luxury safari camps inland, but this is a first for the coast: the Gazi Retreat has 10 simple but sweet tents, with four-posters, on a remote stretch of shoreline south of Mombasa. (Don't worry, you're not wild camping: they have showers and flush lavatories.) There's miles of untouched beach and mangrove to explore, and it has a good bar and pool. You can fish, snorkel, dive, bird-watch... and that's it. Bring a good book or, better still, a good partner - it's very romantic. Prices start at £916, including all meals, with Somak (020 8423 3000, somak.com).

# HOLISTIC TOBAGO

## for £897

Chuck that word "holistic" at a resort and you can usually add 50% to the price. Kariwak Village, by contrast, keeps it simple and economical: yoga, t'ai chi and relaxation classes, a pool, lovely gardens and 24 neat and clean rooms. The beach is five minutes' walk and the restaurant, which
